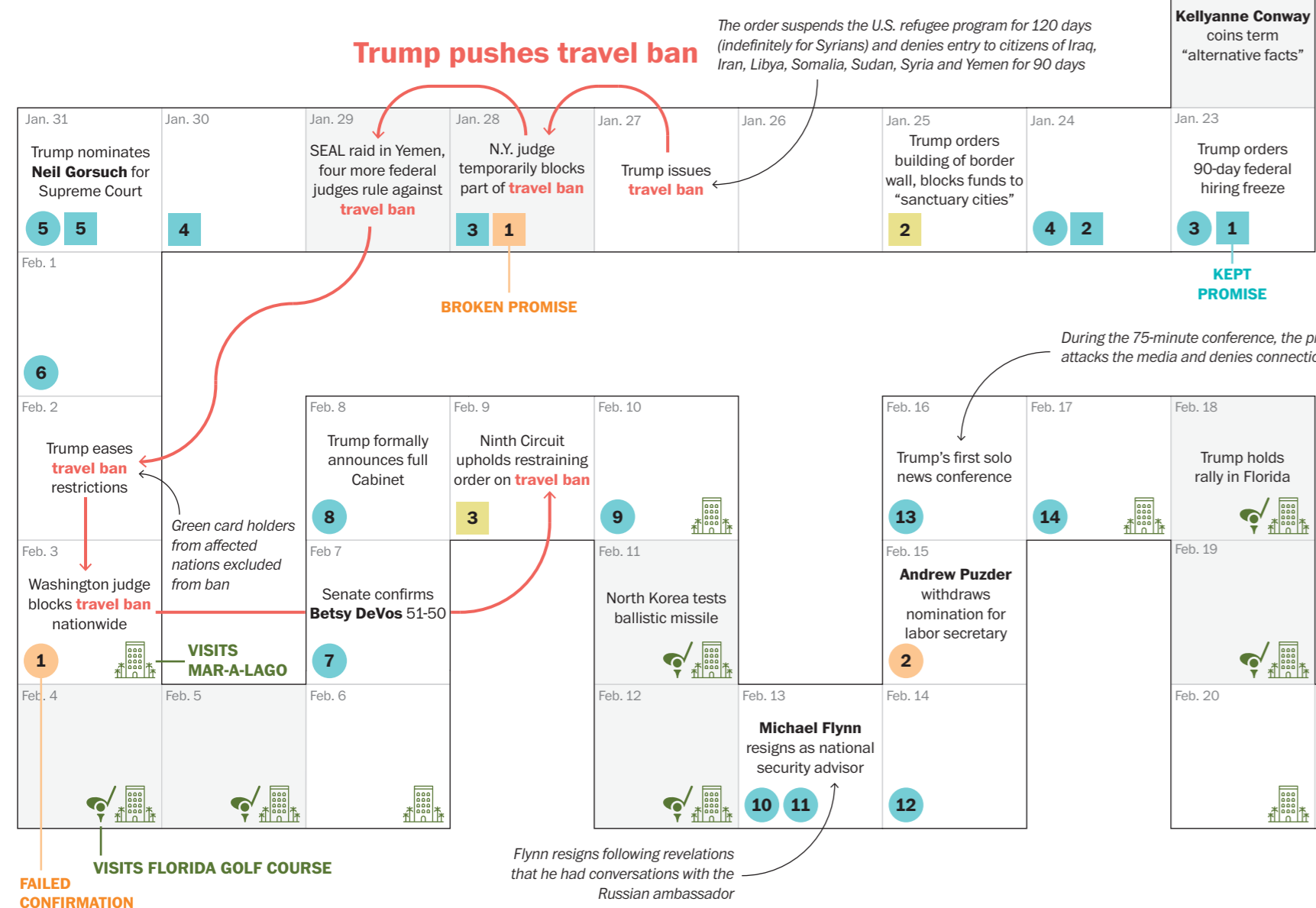


# TRUMP'S FIRST 100 DAYS

The 45th presidency of the United States is now well underway. The Washington Post has been tracking Donald Trump's nominations, promises, approval, and false or misleading claims. Here's where he stands, plus the biggest events of his first 100 days.



## Staffing up

The Washington Post and the Partnership for Public Service have been tracking 556 of the executive branch positions that require Senate confirmation.

531 key positions requiring Senate confirmation not yet filled. However 40, of those positions have a formal nominee who's awaiting confirmation, and another 26 have been announced but are awaiting formal nomination.

## Following through

On October 22nd, 2016 Donald Trump issued a set of 60 promises called the "Contract with the American Voter." The Washington Post Fact Check team has been tracking the status of each of these pledges.

6 promises kept

- 1 Announce the U.S. withdrawal from the Trans-Pacific Partnership
- 2 Lift the Obama-Clinton roadblocks and allow vital energy infrastructure projects, like the Keystone Pipeline, to move forward
- 3 Impose a lifetime ban on White House officials lobbying on behalf of a foreign government
- 4 Require that for every new federal regulation, two existing regulations must be eliminated
- 5 Begin the process of selecting a replacement for Justice Antonin Scalia (from list of 20 issued during campaign)
- 6 Announce the U.S. intention to renegotiate NAFTA or withdraw from the deal under Article 2205
- 1 Create at least 10 million jobs in the first term
- 2 Fund the construction of a wall on our southern border
- 3 Create a task force on violent crime
- 4 Begin removing the more than 2 million criminal illegal immigrants from the country
- 5 Let states manage Medicaid funds
- 6 Expand military investment
- 7 Eliminate the defense sequester
- 8 Redirect education money to give parents the right to send their kid to the public, private, charter, magnet, religious or home school of their choice
- 9 Lift the restrictions on the production of \$50 trillion worth of job-producing American energy reserves, including shale, oil, natural gas and clean coal
- 10 Reduce the number of tax brackets from seven to three, and likewise greatly simplify tax forms
- 11 Lower the business tax rate from 35 percent to 15 percent

11 promises launched

5 promises broken

- 1 Impose a five-year ban on White House and congressional officials becoming lobbyists after they leave government service
- 2 Make two- and four-year college more affordable
- 3 Fully repeal and replace Obamacare
- 4 Cancel visas to foreign countries that won't take back criminal illegal immigrants
- 5 Direct the secretary of the treasury to label China a currency manipulator

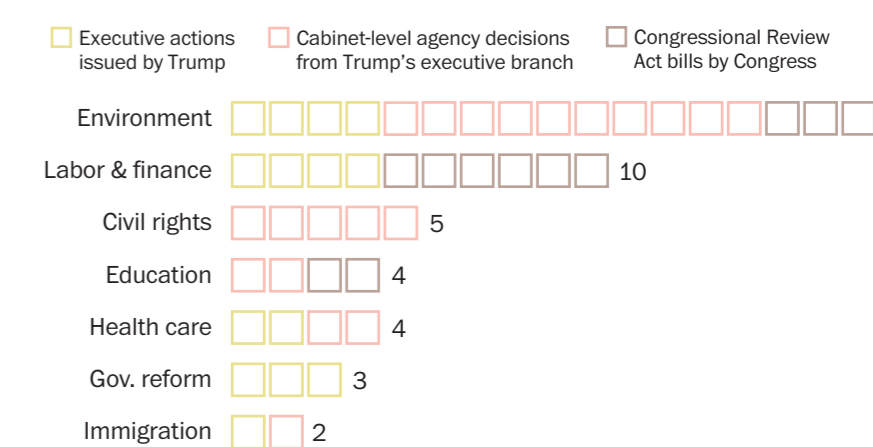
3 stuck promises

- 1 Expand vocational and technical education
- 2 Suspend immigration from terror-prone regions where vetting cannot safely occur
- 3 Cancel all federal funding to sanctuary cities

1 compromise

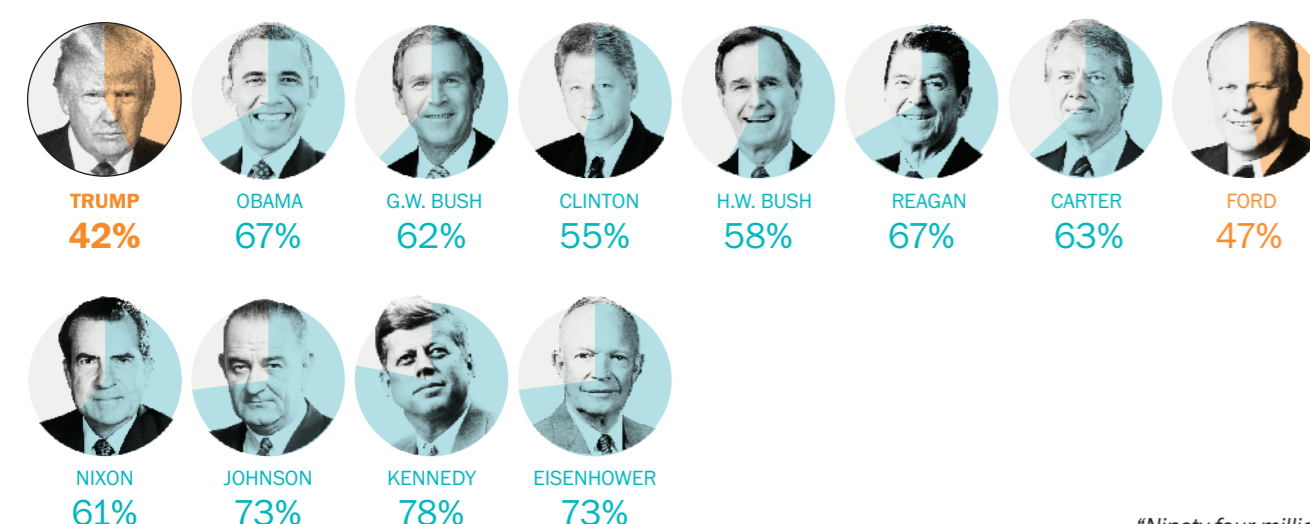
- 1 Impose a hiring freeze on all federal employees to reduce the federal workforce through attrition (excepting military, public safety and public health)

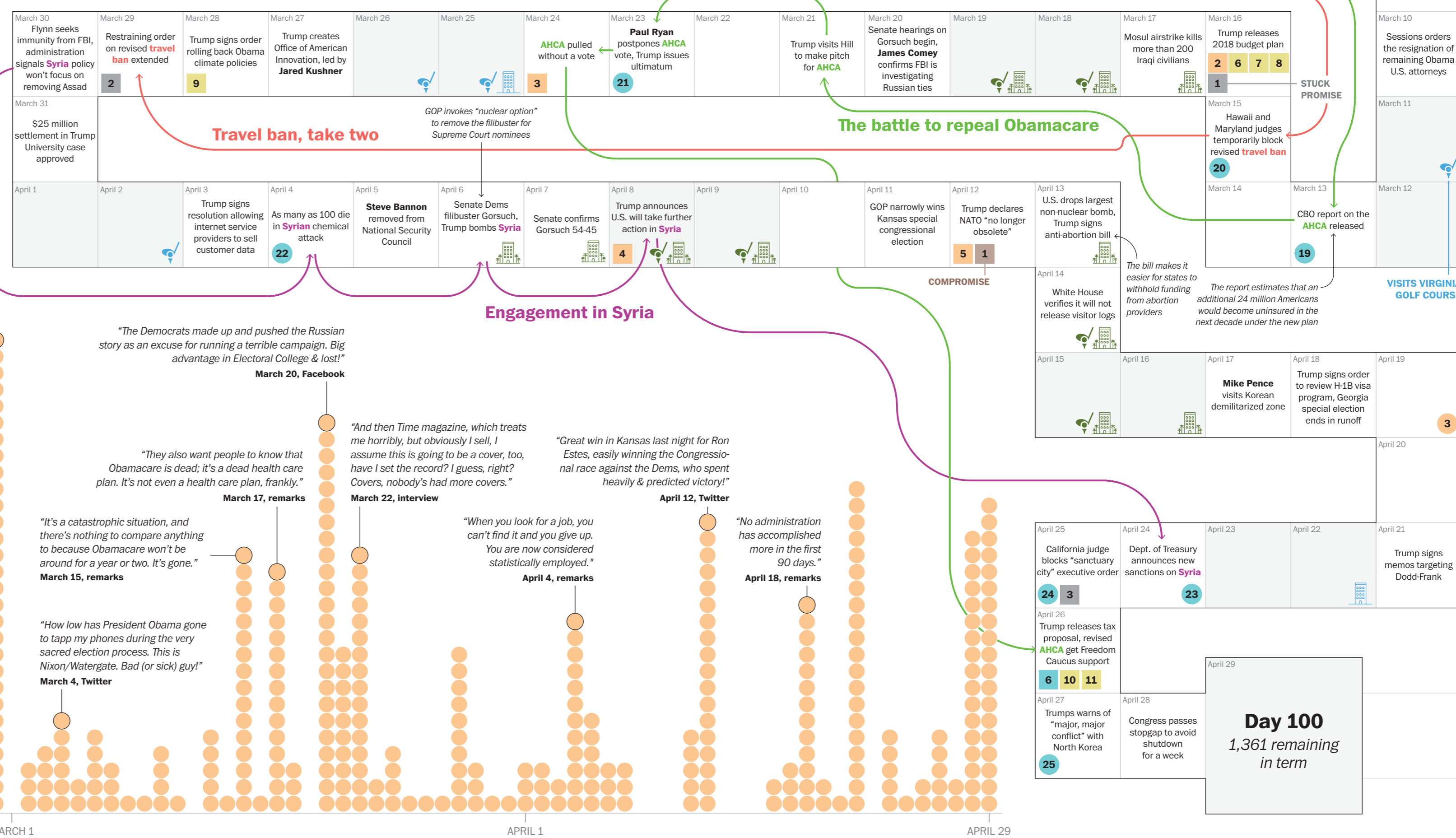
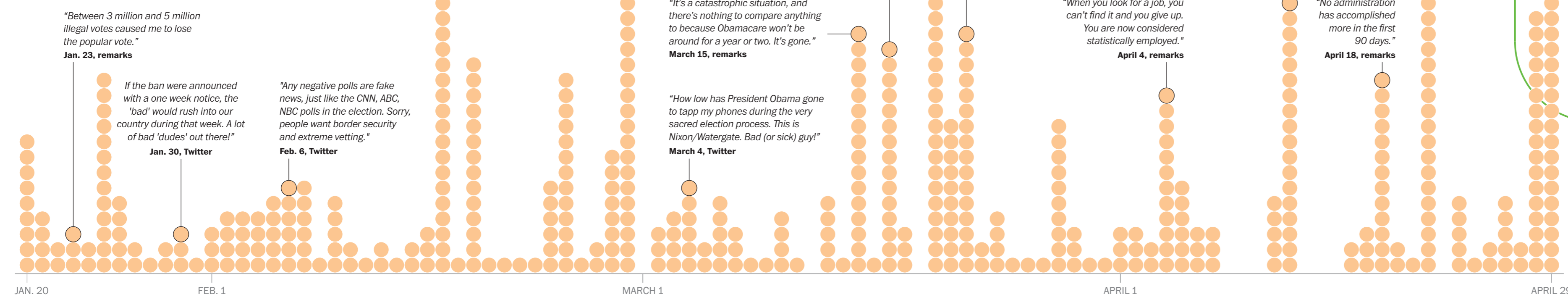
## The battle for hearts and minds
